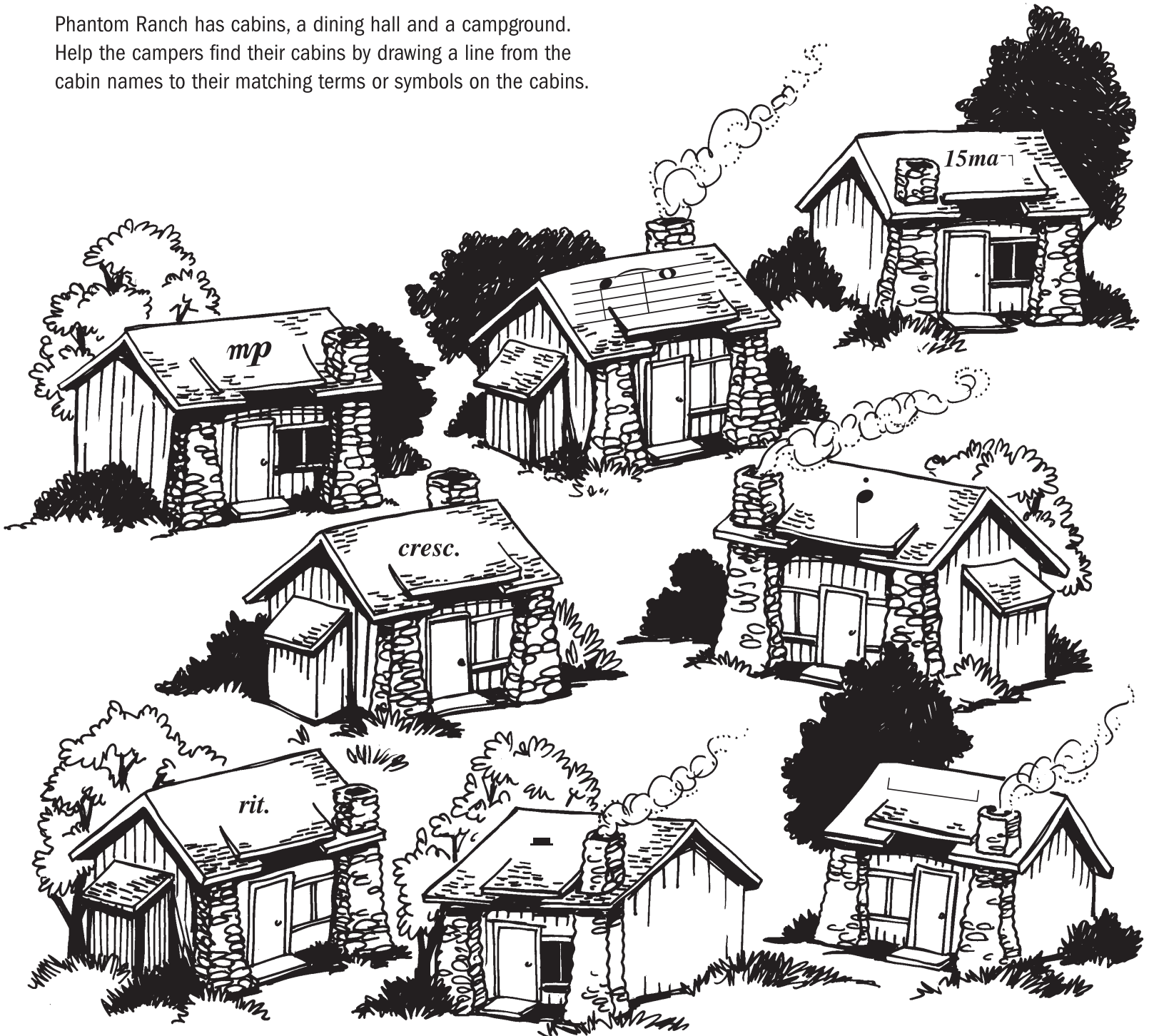


Visitors to Grand Canyon National Park can see the canyon from either the North or the South Rim. The South Rim is the more popular of the two. The park has 36 hiking trails that cover 400 miles. Of the three main trails into the canyon, two begin on the South Rim and one on the North Rim. These trails connect at the bottom of the Canyon at Phantom Ranch.

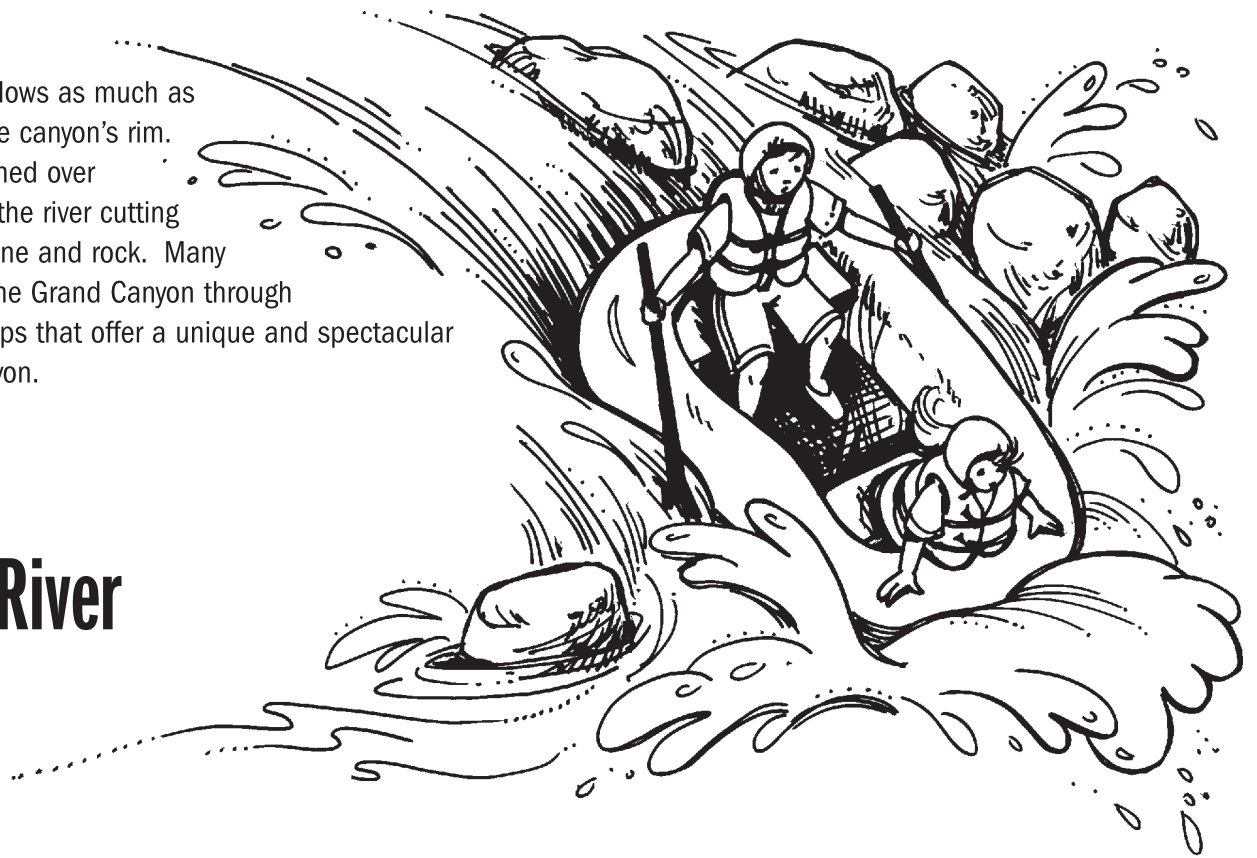
