Nessun Dorma *from Turandot*

THE WORK: Giacomo Puccini (1858-1924), composed his opera Turandot, in 1924. It was his last opus, and was completed after his death by Alfano. The first production was at La Scala, Milan, in April, 1926. Turandot is the name of the daughter of the Emperor of China. Nessun Dorma (Let no-one sleep), is an aria for the tenor, Calaf. People die in this opera, but Calaf, whose name is translated as "Love", is happily united with Turandot in the end.

THE ARRANGEMENT: This is a trumpet or trombone feature beginning to end. The dynamic of the soloist should soar far above the accompanying parts. The player should also probably stand at the front of the group to aid in this balance.
