PRONUNCIATION/TRANSLATION

Yoo-kee yah, kohn, kohn.
(Snow is falling, kon, kon.)
Ah-rah-reh yah, kohn, kohn.
(Hail is falling, kon, kon.)
Foo-teh wah, foo-teh wah, zoon, zoon tsoo-moh-roo.
(The more it falls, the more it lies.)
Kah-reh-kee noh-koh rah-zoo hah-nah gah sah-koo.
(Little snow flowers bloom on the tree.)

NOTE: The phrase “kon, kon” is a Japanese expression for the falling motion of snow.
