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### NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This chart captures the style of the current swing bands. A bright tempo and a two feel from the rhythm section start things off. The bass should clearly determine the two feel with written half notes and the drummer can echo with the dotted quarter-eighth-half note pattern. When the feel changes into a four at measure 25, both the drummer and bass player should dig in and establish the new driving four feel.

The articulation for the saxes at measure 9 should sound like "doo-dit-dot" and then the same for the brass at measure 17. Solos are written out; however, soloists should experiment with improvisation by first playing and learning the written solo and then embellishing the written solo with similar rhythms and other notes from the chord. Always keep the melody in mind when soloing. Any backgrounds behind soloists should be played at an appropriate volume.
