NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

Herbie Hancock composed this tune in the early 1960s and recorded it on his first record, *Takin' Off*. Since this initial recording, *Watermelon Man* has become a staple of the jazz repertoire.

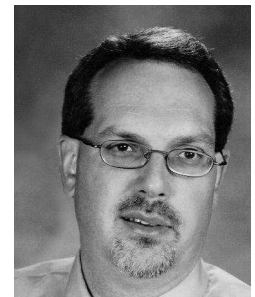
In this chart, the opening figures in the saxes in measure 1, and brass and baritone sax in measure 2, should be articulated in a consistent manner. Throughout the arrangement, all players should strive to consistently execute capped rooftop accents using a "daht" articulation, tenuto marks, and regular accents. The saxophones should release the ties on beat 1 in both measures 9 and 13, and crescendo into these releases. The brass should imitate this in their statement of the melody in measures 25 and 29.

Measure 40 is an open solo section with 40–43 acting as a "send off" for each soloist. While written solos are provided in the 1st alto and 1st tenor parts, I highly encourage you to open up this section to feature improvised solos by a variety of your students. The background figures at measure 56 should compliment but not over power the soloist(s).

Measure 72 begins an ensemble section for the horns and hi-hat. To maximize rehearsal time, my suggestion would be to rehearse trumpets and alto saxophones separate from the tenor and baritone saxophones and trombones. The trumpet and alto saxophones should strive to articulate and blend together in this passage. Direct the rhythm section to make a confident entrance in measure 85 and the entire ensemble should crescendo together in 88. This leads us into the "shout" section at measure 90. Regarding dynamics at this point, all horn parts should be equal volume for blend and balance purposes. Measure 98 begins a series of exchanges between the ensemble and drums. Written solos are provided here but I recommend having your drummer improvise through this passage. However, the drummer should play the kicks with the horn section.

I hope you and your students enjoy playing my arrangement of *Watermelon Man*.
