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I. Tune Up - Warm Up

For tuning purposes the band is divided into four basic groups. Group I includes Flutes, Piccolos, Oboes, Eb Clarinets and Bb Soprano Clarinets. (Bells optional)

UNISON TUNING is accomplished by utilizing measures 1 and 2 of each line. A reliable instrument or tuning device should be used to tune the instruments in Group IV. Other groups are then added to this unison.

The tendency of the note to be *flat* or *sharp* is indicated by a symbol to the right of the note. Students should adjust pitches accordingly. The Arabic numerals to the left of the note indicate the note's position within the chord.
