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



# Dodge Drum Chart for Reading Drum Music

simply shows how all ordinary drum music may be classified under two well known rudimentary beats: viz: the Flam a cue and the Flam accent; so that the right hand is always on the first of the measure with the bass drum beat.

F = right hand flam

(F) = left hand flam

R = right hand tap

L = left hand tap

### **How to Use Dodge Drum Chart**

Suppose you want to know how to play the following measure:



You look in the right hand column of your chart and find this same measure (**No. 28**) and the left hand column shows you that this measure is like the model measure at the top of the column except that the third and sixth counts are omitted. Therefore this measure is played
