

### THE MUSIC ALPHABET



Note from the above arrangement of notes on the staff that there are seven letters of the alphabet used in music, namely,


#### A-B-C-D-E-F-G

Teacher: Help the student locate and play each of the above notes on the keyboard. These notes may be played with one finger.

The letter f comes from the Italian word "forte", which means "loud". The letter p comes from the Italian word "piano", which means "soft". Two f's (ff) mean "very loud"; two p's (pp) mean "very soft".
