FRANZ JOSEPH HAYDN (1732-1809) - Haydn composed 104 symphonies and is called the father of the symphony form. He was born in Austria, close to the border of Hungary. He studied music at an early age and sang, played the violin and harpsichord—all very well. By the time he was 24 years old, he was already famous as a teacher and composer.
