#### **ROGRAM NOTE**

This happy music is based on a traditional African folk song from the Republic of Zambia. Though English is the country's official language, Bemba is spoken most frequently as a secondary regional language. Literal word-for-word translations are difficult because of the complexity of the language. However, "Bonse Aba" loosely translated from Bemba equates to "all who sing." Compelling rhythms and solid harmonies all come together in presenting this musical celebration of life, a joyful experience for players and audiences alike.

#### NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

Involve all of your players in learning the key rhythm set out in the bass line in the first measure. Just about everyone will encounter it at one time or another. Hand clapping or call-and-response will work well, in addition to having percussion play along to help everyone feel the groove. Five levels of dynamics are used throughout (*piano* to *fortissimo*). Incorporating this dimension into your warm-up exercises would be an effective way to focus your players' sensitivity on this important facet of the work. Depending on the size of your ensemble, consider using more than one drum. This could create a powerful visual image on stage. Lastly, adding a "pizzicato" string bass (reading the Tuba part an octave higher) would help add depth to the bass voices.
