The Kyrie or Kyrie eleison (Lord have mercy) is a prayer sung immediately following the Introit during the opening Entrance rite of the Roman Catholic Mass. It is the first section of the Ordinary of the Mass, those sections of the Mass which remain mostly unchanged throughout the Liturgical year.

The words of the *Kyrie*, which are similar to Psalm 6: 3 and Psalm 40: 5, 11, are found as far back as the 4th century. In the 5th century, a litany replaced the common Prayer of the Church and Pope Gelasius I (492-496) retained the Greek form as the people's response and moved it to the beginning of the Mass. It was Pope Gregory I who added the second portion, *Christe eleison*. The complete three-part (ABA) form of the *Kryie*, as we know it today, was first used in the 8th century.

In Latin, all vowel sounds should be pure and unchanging. Below is a pronunciation and translation guide for use with this piece.

Kyrie eleison. Keé-ree-eh eh-léh-ee-sawn (Lord have mercy.)

Christe eleison.

Kreé-steh eh-léh-ee-sawn
(Christ have mercy.)
