# PROGRAM NOTES

This work was commissioned by the Holland Michigan American Legion Band for thier director, Mr. Scott A. Vanden Berg. Upon beginning the creation of thismusic I was informed that Scott has a deep love of both the Doxology, as well as O Sacred Head Now Wounded. With that knowledge I set out to create music that is based on these two hymns. In addition to his position of director of the Holland American Legion Band, Scott is also a high school band and orchestra director at Holland Christian Schools. While this work is written specifically for the Legion Band, I also wanted to create something that Scott could take back to his students and enjoy with them. In addition, Scott is an alumnus of the university where I currently teach. I also wanted to find a way to connect Dordt University into this music as a tip of the hat as Scott's alma mater. With all of that, I arrived at this work. The work opens with a somewhat militaristic setting of the Doxology. The transition from the opening theme to a faster usage of the Doxology is created by a trumpet solo stating the melody from O Sacred Head Now Wounded. This help transition us into a statement of the Doxology that is accompanied by different harmonies in a more sycopated fashion. We then are brought to a fugue written using the primary melody from O Sacred Head Now Wounded. This fugue brings us to a grand restatement of the Doxology and a closing fanfare.
