NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

Burritos to Go is a Latin rock, so it should be played with even (straight) eighth notes. Play rooftop accents detached (^), but not too short. As a general rule, play the last eighth note in a group short.

The opening trumpet melody in measure 8 should be lyrical and smooth. Refer to measure 17, and direct the trombones to play the quarter notes even, short (but not clipped), and with accurate time. Encourage them to listen and lock in with the rhythm section. Trombones should also make the most of the dynamics at measure 33. The baritone sax part has a few exposed lines, and should dig into these sections.

For the solo section at measure 57, players should become familiar with the sound of the roots of each chord in the progression. Next, learn the common tones of the chords. Finally, begin to embellish the written solo. When the soloists are comfortable with this process, they should move toward playing their own improvisations using only the chord changes.

The rhythm section should practice the section beginning at measure 41 individually. The challenge is to lock in the time and groove while attacking and releasing notes in a section. Additionally, the bass played should be confident in playing the written rhythmic pattern. I highly suggest practicing with a metronome to gain confidence with rhythm and playing a steady beat.
