#### **PROGRAM NOTES**

Beethoven's resplendent "Ode to Joy" is brought to life in an exciting arrangement designed to foster instant success for ensembles of less experienced players. The solid scoring, with its ample doubling and liberal use of the unison line, will surely boost confidence, resulting in a more secure performance. All wind parts are assigned some portion of the melody in the course of the work. Audiences will thrill to the instantly recognizable tune, and players will be amazed at how quickly they master their parts.

### NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

With each wind part utilizing only five or six consecutive notes that are played with ease at this elementary level, the work just about plays itself. Adding to this, there is no subdivision of the beat occurring throughout and no rolls scored in the percussion parts.

Dynamics play a key role in insuring proper balance of the theme and accompanying figures. This is an especially crucial element in the percussion parts. These are to be considered for texture only and should not predominate the performance.

Full value for quarter notes followed by a rest should be stressed. Slurs may be omitted if necessary.
