The opening of Fanfare Esprit should establish the marcato style that will be a feature throughout the piece. The first treatment of the melody should be bright and have lots of energy. The second treatment of the tune presents a contrast with a cantabile style but the underlying energy should not be sacrificed. The moving horn and baritone line should be used to "push" the melody further. The final treatment of the melody should be very triumphant and the trumpet obligato needs to be brought to the fore to enhance this concept.
