


In Ex. 1 and 2 write the principal chords in triad form in the indicated major keys. Watch the clef sign carefully. Write the letter name of each chord above.




In Ex. 3 and 4 write these same chords as they would appear in arpeggio form. Watch the clef sign carefully. Write the letter name of each chord above.



Transpose the melody from D on page 10 in the treble clef to the key of E, with the proper chords in the bass clef. Write the Roman numerals and letter names of the chords.





# SAXOPHONE QUARTET

Now that we have learned to find the proper key for the transposing instruments, we must learn the actual sound of each in relation to Concert Pitch. For example, let us take the Saxophones:

- Music for the Eb Alto Saxophone is written a MAJOR SIXTH above the actual sound.
- B Music for the B Tenor Saxophone is written ONE OCTAVE plus a MAJOR SECOND above the actual sound.
- Music for the Eb Baritone Saxophone is written ONE OCTAVE plus a MAJOR SIXTH above the actual sound.





The SATB arrangement of the first six bars of "America" is transposed below for Saxophone Quartet.




