The Everglades

The Florida Everglades, "River of Grass," is a vast marsh covering much of South Florida. Numerous islets (known as hammocks) are covered with lush vegetation due to the tropical climate, and are surrounded by sawgrass that rises 3 to 10 feet above the surface of the water. This river of grass teems with abundant wildlife, including fish, wading birds, deer, alligators, and the endangered Florida panther. The Florida Everglades National Park attracts over a million visitors annually.



The Suwannee River

The Suwannee River, also known as "Swannee" River, was made famous by Stephen Foster's song "Old Folks at Home." This is Florida's state song. The Suwannee River rises in the Okefenokee Swamp in southern Georgia and flows in a southwestern course in northern Florida into the Gulf of Mexico, near the picturesque town of Cedar Key.

Many crystal clear cold springs empty into the river along the way.
