## Performance Notes from the Writers

A Canine Christmas Concerto (The Twelve Dogs of Christmas) is a novelty piece for the Christmas holidays. We envision it as a performance that would be rendered with mock seriousness and a certain degree of stage drama.

- 1. The Chorus ("Humans") needs no special costuming and may use music if necessary or may memorize their parts.
- 2. The Solo Group ("The Dogs") should wear exaggerated dog collars and a variety of dog ears which could be attached to caps or headbands. Studded collars would be good for the large dogs, jewelled collars for the small dogs. Formal dress for the dogs would add a really foolish and incongruous touch if you wish to go all out in costuming.
- 3. Dogs should be auditioned for their "barks." You may use one to three dogs on each part. It might be fun to let the students in on the audition and final selection of "barkers":
  - "arf" dogs should have high vippy voices
  - "ruff" dogs should have medium range voices
  - "woof" dogs should have low range growly voices
- 4. "The Dogs" vocal parts will be tricky to memorize as each stanza is different, so even if the Chorus sings from memory the stage should be set with one music stand for each dog. Black orchestral stands would create a more "formal" look than the lightweight fold-up variety.
- 5. Dogs may enter upright on leashes and their "owners" may unleash each dog at the appropriate music stand.
- 6. Solo voices in the Chorus may be assigned to individual phrases if you desire. For example, it might be fun to have one singer with a distinctive voice who always sings "and a Schnauzer with a goatee" as a solo.
- 7. At the close of the performance all performers may bow with a special acknowledgement for "The Dogs." Owners may leash their dogs and exit.
- 8. A Carine Christmas Concerto will make your holiday celebration memorable. (Any combination of 2-part voices may perform this piece.) It might be just the perfect closer for a Holiday "Pups" Concert!
